

What follows IGCSE?

(AS and A2)

- Designed for students in Years 12 & 13
- Subject course = approximately 160 hours per year
- AS + A2 = a full A Level
- An international University Entrance qualification recognised and valued throughout the world
- Grades available: A*, A, B, C, D, E, U

What are the Avondale College AS/A2 Courses?

Accounting, Biology, Business Studies, Chemistry, English, French, Geography, History, Applied ICT, Japanese, Mathematics, Music, Physics, Psychology, Spanish.

(Other AS and A2 courses may be added.)

How can CAIE be used for University Entrance (UE) in NZ?

At least three AS Levels with D Grade minimum (*Equivalent to NCEA Level 3 and 14 credits in each of 3 subjects*)

Plus Literacy Standard Grade E in AS English (D grade for University of Auckland) (*Equivalent to NCEA Level 2 Literacy – five reading and five writing credits*)

Plus Numeracy Standard Grade D in IGCSE Mathematics (*Equivalent to NCEA Level 1 Numeracy – 10 credits*) (and 120 UCAS Points in Total – minimum entry requirement)

Further Points

- **Examination fees:** \$185 per IGCSE subject, \$190 per AS/A2 subject, due end of Term 2 (dependent on exchange rate)

Restricted Entry Requirements

- As with NCEA, many courses require more than just UE.
- This varies from University to University.
- The University of Auckland requires 150 points for a Bachelor of Arts and up to 310 points for Biomedical Science

How can CAIE be used for University Entrance overseas?

- Accepted subject for subject and grade for grade in lieu of UK AS and A Levels for admission to all the world's major English speaking Universities.
- A Level grade combinations: AAA, AAB, (e.g. Ivy League and Oxford/Cambridge) or ABB, BBB... for others.
- University course credit and advanced standing is often available in countries such as the US and Canada (e.g. one full year of credit).

Consult the CAIE recognition website and individual university websites for entrance information.

- Assessment support is available (e.g. special assessment, special consideration, etc)
- Organisation and commitment are essential for CAIE success

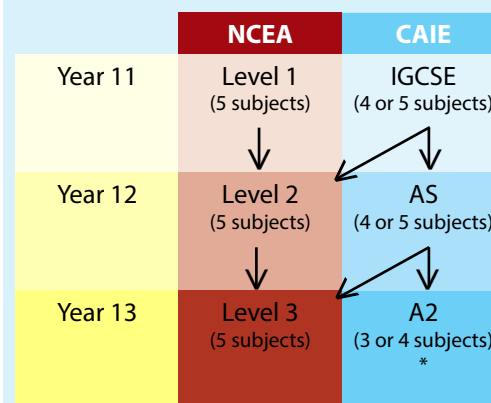

* Approximate parity with NZ Scholarship or Year 1 University

How does a student move along the CAIE pathway at Avondale College?

Year 10: Some students are accelerated in Maths (either NCEA or IGCSE)

Year 11: 5 IGCSE
or 4 IGCSE + 1 AS

Year 12: 4 AS Level + 1 IGCSE
or 5 AS Level

Year 13: 3 A2s + 1AS
or 4 A2s

Note: 1 A Level = AS + A2 in a single subject
(Students finish with 3 or 4 A Levels overall)

How does CAIE operate?

- Examinations in October/November (AS resits in May/June)
- Separate exam papers for separate syllabus components (eg. IGCSE Chemistry is three papers)
- Practical examinations in the AS Sciences
- Results are provided as grades and percentages

How does a student start CAIE?

- IGCSE is designed for students in Year 11
- It is ideal preparation for AS/A2 Level
- Subjects available from: Science, Arts, Humanities, English, Mathematics, Languages, Business and Technology.
- Grades available:
Extended: A*, A, B, C, D, E, F, G, U
Core: C, D, E, F, G, U

What IGCSE courses are offered at Avondale College?

- Accounting, Biology, Business Studies, Chemistry, Applied ICT, English Literature, French, Geography, History, Mathematics, Music, Physics, Physical Education, Spanish
- A student may take four IGCSE subjects and one NCEA subject.
- (Other IGCSE syllabuses may be added.)
