At Avondale College we are proud of our school uniform and the sense of identity that it provides our community. Students are expected to wear correct uniform and maintain tidy appearance and grooming at all times. Individual queries regarding uniform should be directed to the relevant Dean in the first instance.

Avondale College uniform is purchased from our on site College Shop and should be worn as purchased. Uniform should be worn when attending the College, travelling to and from the College and attending school functions, for example sports tours, cultural visits and school trips.

If a student is unable to obtain correct uniform items they should speak to their Dean. Grants for uniform are available in some instances. If students are unable to wear the correct uniform item for one day, they should bring a note from home to their Dean when they arrive to school in the morning. They may be loaned uniform for the day, or a uniform pass may be issued for items that are very similar to uniform.

Students may not wear or display any symbols or regalia that perpetuate or represent hate, discrimination or are insensitive to diversity. Non-uniform items may be confiscated and held in the College Shop. Confiscated items can be collected at the end of term, or by arrangement with the Dean.

Our uniform regulations aim to be inclusive and respect Te Tiriti o Waitangi. Students may wear taonga Māori such as tā moko, pounamu or hei tiki.

**BADGES:** students may wear Avondale College academic, service, leadership and sports badges that have been awarded by our school. Other badges may not be worn on uniform.

**BELTS:** if worn, must be black and plain.

**HAIR** must be clean, tidy and a single, natural colour. Students may be asked to tie hair back for some subjects, for health and safety reasons. Headbands, hair ties or ribbons should be plain black or white.

**HATS / SCARVES:** must be Avondale College school caps or scarves. These items are for outdoor wear only.

**HEADWEAR:** students may wear a hijab, turban or similar if required. Such items should be plain black or white.

**JACKETS:** must be Avondale College jackets.

**JEWELLERY:** students may wear a watch and a plain gold or silver stud or sleeper in one or each ear lobe. No nose studs or piercings on any other part of the face are allowed. Students are advised not to wear items that are of high sentimental value or cost.

**MAKE UP:** students may not wear makeup, nail polish, false eyelashes, false nails.

**SCHOOL BAGS:** should be large enough to hold books and a laptop, and must be graffiti-free.

## SCHOOL SHOES

- The regulation school shoe is black, with an all leather upper (not canvas or with a rubber toe), lace-up, free from manufacturers' logos, cut below the ankle.
- Sandals are to be regulation black leather Roman sandals with back straps, which must be worn without socks.
- No sports shoes



**SHAVING:** faces are to be clean-shaven.

**SOCKS:** must be plain black crew socks (over the ankle). Students who choose to wear the Avondale College long socks must wear them pulled up.

**SPORTS UNIFORMS, TRACKSUITS AND HOODIES:** may be issued to some teams for the season, or available to Premier Sport Teams to purchase. They may not be worn as school uniform.

**T-SHIRTS / VESTS:** if worn, these must be white and not be visible beneath the school shirt. No long-sleeved garment may be worn under a short sleeved shirt.
